


## How to choose a grab rail for a LH Transfer and a RH Transfer in an Accessible Bathroom

If you've noticed an Accessible Toilet sign with the letters 'RH' or 'LH,' you may have wondered what they signify. These letters are essential in ensuring the usability of the facility for individuals in wheelchairs.

 RH (Right-Hand Transfer): This indicates that the person in a wheelchair will transfer to the toilet on their right-hand side. The grab rail is positioned on the right, and the layout provides ample space for a safe and comfortable transfer.

## **Example of Right Hand Transfer for Accessible Toilet**

• LH (Left-Hand Transfer): Similarly, this means the person will transfer to the toilet on their left-hand side. The grab rail is located on the left, with adequate room for the transition.

These designations are crucial for accessibility and safety, ensuring that the facilities cater to the diverse needs of users.
